### Notice of Race (NOR) and Sailing Instructions (SIs)

- 1.1 The Regatta will be governed by the **Racing Rules of Sailing** (RRS), except where varied by these NOR/SIs. *Individual points of variance are not listed.*
- 1.2 The Equipment Rules of sailing (ERS) shall apply, except where varied by Class Rules.
- 2 Competitors should note that the FFSC implements the [RYA Racing Charter](#) and that they will be expected to sail in compliance with it. The charter can be found at the front of the RYA edition of the Racing Rules of Sailing 2021-2024 (the yellow pages after the definitions), or on the RYA website at [www.rya.org.uk/racingrules](http://www.rya.org.uk/racingrules).
- 3 **Entry Classes:** Cat handicap SCHRS 1.429 or less and Monohull dinghy handicap PR 1208 (ILCA 4.7) or less. Dart 16 and other classes if numbers permit will be given separate results.  
**Entry fees:** FFSC Members: FREE  
Visitors: One crew - £20, Two crew - £25

- 4 For FFSC **Boat Hire**, camping and motorhome parking details, see entry form.
- 5 Felixstowe Ferry has limited launching and for events with large numbers of boats so we ask competitors not to block access points to the beach when launching and recovering. Launching will take place on the beach and slipway at the front of the club. Boats shall not be launched from the public slipway adjacent to the jetty.
- 6 **Insurance.** Each boat must have minimum third party cover of £3 million per incident.
- 7 **Registration** will be online through the entry form.
- 8 **Communication with Competitors**
  - 9.1 Notices to Competitors (NTC) will be posted on the Official Notice Board (ONB) in the Club lobby area.

10 **Changes to SIs** will be posted on the ONB at least 1 hour before the scheduled start me of the first race of the day. Flag 'L' will be displayed. Changes will refer to specific SIs where appropriate.

11 Adequate **Personal Buoyancy** shall be worn by all competitors at all times when afloat except briefly while changing or adjusting clothing or personal equipment. Wet and dry suits do not constitute adequate personal flotation.

12 **Signals made ashore** will be displayed from the mast adjacent to the Race Box. When flag 'AP' is displayed ashore it will be removed not less than 45 minutes before the postponed start.

13 **Briefing** for competitors will be at 11.00 at the Club on Saturday 10th August.

16 **Mandatory Tally System**

16.1 A Tally Number System will not be in place.

16.2 Boats will be released by the beach master shortly after noon.

17 **Race Area**

17.1 Racing will take place within 2 nautical miles of the club to the east, seaward of the Knolls shingle banks. There is no significant commercial traffic, but numerous leisure vessels possibly with limited manoeuvrability, especially in the narrow marked channel, use the River.

17.2 The exact position of The Knolls shingle banks and channels is unknown at time of writing.

Details will be made available at the briefing and ONB, and updates to these Sis.

17.3 If conditions dictate races will be held inside the River.

17.4 Groyne and pier end markers and areas between these and the shore are obstructions.

17.5 Boats should not sail through the moorings except for launching and recovery.

18 **Official Boats**

18.1 Committee Boat (CB), will be notified at the briefing and ONB.

18.2 Safety Boats (SB), RIBs: *Miss Deben, Giles, Black Betty, Jubilee* will also act as mark boats.

19 **Marks**

- 19.1 The Start marks are described in SI 21.1,
- 19.2 Windward rounding mark 1 will be a black cylindrical inflatable buoy,
- 19.3 Rounding wing marks 2 and 3, will be green, yellow or red cylindrical inflatable buoys
- 19.4 Lee rounding mark 4 will be yellow "Scandia" inflatable buoy,

19.6 The finish line marks are described in SI 22.1.

20 **Course** (see also diagram para 30)

- 20.1 The course will be a trapezoid; windward, reaching, leeward, reaching, windward.
- 20.2 The Start/Finish line will be on the windward leg approx 25% upwind from the lee mark.
- 20.3 All marks will be taken to port, except for the CB on the start/finish line.
- 20.4 The approximate compass bearing of the first mark may be displayed on a board on the CB.
- 20.5 Boats must pass through the start/finish line on every lap, so completing that lap.
- 20.6 There will be no set number of laps displayed or to be sailed.

21 **Start** will use rule 26 (5-4-1-off) procedure:

Warning signal	Class Flag displayed	1 sound	- 5 minutes
Preparatory signal	Blue Peter P displayed	1 sound	- 4 minutes
One minute signal	Blue Peter removed	1 sound	- 1 minute
START	Class Flag removed	1 sound	0, START

- 21.1 The Start Line will lie between RIB with orange flag on the starboard end, and an orange cylindrical inflatable buoy, port end.
- 21.2 If a boat is OCS at its start, Flag X will be displayed with 1 sound signal. The Race Committee (RC) will attempt to hail her sail number. Failure to hail her number, or if a hail is not heard, or the order of hails, will not be grounds for a request for redress.
- 21.3 For a general recall First Substitute will be displayed with 2 sound signals.
- 21.4 A boat starting later than 5 minutes after her starting signal will be scored 'Did Not Start' (DNS) without a hearing.
- 21.5 For races started under rule 30.4 (Black Flag) that are subject to a general recall, identified OCS/BFD numbers will be displayed on the back of the CB for a minimum of 3 minutes after a long sound signal.

22 **Finish**

- 22.1 The Finish Line will coincide with the Start Line. The Orange staff on flag on the CB *may* be replaced with a blue flag.
- 22.2 The Race will end after 45 to 60 minutes when Flag S is displayed on the CB with 2 sound signals. Each boat will finish the next me it crosses the Finish Line after S is displayed.
- 22.3 Boats may not all sail the same number of laps. Average lap times will be used for handicapping.
- 22.4 After finishing races 1 and 2 boats **must** keep clear of the Finish Line and boats not yet finished, waiting to starboard of CB for the next race start.

- 23 A boat that **retires** shall notify CB/SB/MB as soon as possible.
- 24 **Penalties** - Cats may use a one turn penalty; monohulls must take a two turn penalty except for hitting a mark which incurs a one turn penalty, asap, clear of the mark and other boats.
- 25 There are no set **time limits**, which are at the RO's discretion without grounds for redress.
- 26 **Protests and requests for redress**
- 26.1 Protest forms will be available at the Race Office or ONB.
- 26.2 Protests and requests for redress or reopening shall be delivered there within the protest me limit, which is 60 minutes after the last boat has finished the last race of the day. This same protest me limit applies to protests by the race committee or protest committee.
- 26.3 Notices will be posted no later than 30 minutes after the protest me limit to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses.
- 26.4 Notices of protests by the RC or Protest Committee (PC) will be posted to inform boats under rule 61.1(b).
- 26.6 On Sunday a request for reopening a hearing shall be delivered either:
- a) Within the protest me limit if the requesting party was informed of the decision on the previous day, or b) No later than 30 minutes after the requesting party was informed of the decision on that day.
- 26.7 On Sunday a request for redress based on a PC decision shall be delivered no later than 30 minutes after the decision was posted.
- 26.8 Notices of Protests and Redress hearings posted on the ONB shall be considered sufficient notice to all parties and witnesses. It is the responsibility of parties to consult the ONB at or before notice expiry me before leaving the venue for the day.
- 26.9 The Exoneration Penalty and RYA Arbitration of the [RYA Rules Disputes Procedures](#) will be available. The Exoneration Penalty will be a 30% placing penalty with a minimum of 3 places, but not greater than DNF, and will be scored DPI. The Arbitration Penalty will be the same as the Exoneration Penalty, scored DPI.
- 27.1 **Scoring** The event will use the Low Point Scoring System.
- 27.2 Four races are scheduled; three completed will constitute a series.
- 27.3 If only 3 races are completed, a boat's series score will include all three race scores. If four or more races are completed, the boat's worst score will be discarded.
- 28 **Prizes.** The winner of the Dart 16 National Championships will receive The Dart 16 National Championship Trophy. Other prizes depend on the number of entries.
- 29 **Replacement of Crew or Equipment**
- Any request to substitute a nominated crew shall be submitted at the Race Office before going afloat. The full name of the replacement crew must be provided. Substitution of a crew must not be used for the purpose of gaining an advantage in the race series.
- 30 **Equipment and Measurement Checks**
- Boats may be measured or checked at any me to monitor compliance with the Class Rules. Each boat must possess a measurement certificate or have good evidence of such.
- 31 **Outside Help**
- Any boat that receives outside help, whether permitted by rule 41 or not, shall report the facts to the RC within the time period for protests.

- 27 **Rubbish** may be placed aboard support or official boats, except the Committee Boat. Breaches of RRS 55 may incur a penalty less than disqualification at the discretion of the PC.
- 28 **Radio Communication**  
Except in an emergency, a boat that is racing shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.
- 29 **Risk Statement.** RRS 3 states: *'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone.'*  
By participating in this event each competitor acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds and rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury. Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia or other causes.
